Book launch and signing of the latest publication of the High Wolds Heritage Group

This book is part of the HWHG's oral history project.

Since 2009, Lesley Sharpe has been recording people's memories of living and working in villages and on farms of the High Wolds area. At first the interviews were recorded aurally but more recently, since the group purchased a video camera, they have been videoed to provide a visual record.

In their own words, people describe everyday life during the twentieth century. These conversations, illuminated by photographs, show vividly the lives of ordinary people and give a unique insight into their experiences in the home, at work and in school. Two WWII evacuees speak fondly of their early

childhood years on farms in the Wolds. A *free* DVD of two conversations is included with the book; Chris Whitfield relates amusing tales of Wetwang and Billy Boyes tells us about his long life in Fridaythorpe.

Dr Stefan Ramsden, of the University of Hull, introduced the event and was most complimentary about the oral history investigative techniques that Lesley had used to encourage people to talk freely about their lives.
